Native Art in Wisconsin

Our speaker on March 13 will provide a beautiful, enlightening break from the winter doldrums. [Karen Ann Hoffman](#) is a respected national leader in [Haudenosaunee Raised Beadwork Art](#) and an enrolled citizen of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin. This unique beadwork combines velvet and layered beads, unlike any other Native American art form. Her work is in numerous museum permanent collections, including the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Indian, the Chicago Field Museum, the Iroquois Indian Museum, and the Oneida Nation Museum. Besides creating her own art work, she advocates for Native art by serving on numerous advisory panels, including the Wisconsin Arts Board, as Chair of the Woodland Indian Arts Initiative. She recently has been instrumental in four Native-created permanent public art installations in central Wisconsin.
