April Luncheon Program

The April luncheon program will take place at Hilton Gardens, Sun Prairie. We are very excited to welcome Brenda DeVita, artistic director of American Players Theater, as our speaker this month.

APT is one of the country's most popular Shakespeare festival theaters, welcoming more than 110,000 patrons each season to its home outside of Spring Green, WI. In 2014, the Wall Street Journal called APT the "best classical theater in the country." If you haven't yet enjoyed a summer evening under the stars at APT, you really need to attend this program to hear about what you have been missing. APT has two theaters, the newly renovated 1089-seat outdoor amphitheater and the 201-seat indoor Touchstone Theatre. From June through November, APT produces nine plays in rotating repertory. With an annual budget in excess of \$6 million, APT ranks as the country's second largest outdoor theater devoted to the classics.

APT is celebrating its 40th anniversary this summer and Brenda DeVita has been around for 24 of those remarkable seasons. She's worn many hats for the organization through the years and now, as the company's top artistic visionary, she's excited to share a bit about what makes APT unique and why this milestone season will be so special.
