Join Nick Hoffman, Administrator of Museums and Historic Sites at the Wisconsin Historical Society, as he shares how the agency's twelve museums and historic sites enrich and transform our lives through unparalleled access to history. Hoffman will explain how the society expanded access for PK-12 programs through Covid-19 and how the historic sites are rebounding as they prepare new programs and experiences for this year. With the location secured and an exhibit design firm in contract, Hoffman will also update the growing momentum as the new history center project in downtown Madison enters its next years of development.

Nicholas J. Hoffman's prior employment includes leadership positions at Elkhart County Historical Museum in Bristol, Indiana, the Missouri Historical Society in St. Louis, and History Museum at the Castle in Appleton, Wisconsin. His cumulative work in Appleton contributed to the museum receiving the prestigious National Medal from the Institute of Museums and Library Services. His co-authored book *Wheel Fever: How Wisconsin Became a Great Bicycling State*, as well as his exhibitions and community engagement work, have received numerous state and national accolades Hoffman received a BA in History and an MA in public history from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and is a 2018 graduate of the History Leadership Institute. He has over 13 years of museum experience including working at Old World Wisconsin as a research consultant.


Virtual Fundraising Event
