Service Partner News

Open Doors for Refugees(ODFR) Kick-off Speakers

Introducing Open Doors for Refugees to Who's New in Madison at the September 8 luncheon will be ODFR Leadership Council member (and WNIM member) Madeline Urameck and Iraqi arrival Huda Ibrahim Alalawi.

Huda and her husband came to Madison from Baghdad, Iraq. She has recently put her crocheting and knitting skills to good use and started a home business on Etsy, Knitting for Peace. Huda has two young sons, Hussein and Hasan, and a business partner, Rokaya, a former refugee from Syria.



Madeline Urameck has volunteered with ODFR since its beginning in 2016. Her most intimate contact with refugees began in 1994, when she met a cleaning woman of Tibetan ethnicity at her workplace. They became friends; she helped Tenzin bring her husband and four kids to Madison, and in 2018 Madeline wrote a book, *How to Make a Life*, about her and the family's experiences and misconceptions together.



Volunteer for ODFR

Please consider volunteering your time to support ODFR. Their volunteer needs include driving, event and fundraiser coordination, and help with skill-building.

Here's a report from members who have already started volunteering for the organization.

A number of WNIM members attended Open Doors for Refugees Annual Community Picnic in Olin Park on June 29.

After that, Service Committee member Jan Klein and a few others jumped right into volunteering with ODFR. Says Jan, "Volunteering makes me



really appreciate all the coordination it takes to help new refugees." First, Jan submitted her name for driver's license and background checks to be able to work directly with refugee families. On the Donations Team, Jan has already helped several other ODFR volunteers pick up furniture at three different locations and deliver them to a warehouse, where ODFR stores its pre-move-in items.

On the ODFR Transportation team, Jan successfully drove a male Afghan newcomer and two Afghan women from their apartment to an orientation session. "It went surprisingly smoothly," she said. "They didn't speak English and I don't speak Pashto, but hand gestures worked well." [Click for Volunteering Info](#)
