## March 10 Luncheon Program

MMoCA, Madison Museum of Contemporary Art, is one of our city's hidden gems. You've undoubtedly walked by it as you strolled on State Street. The beautiful staircase is visible through the wall of windows that make up one end of the building, located at 227 State Street, but have you ever ventured inside? MMoCA has three levels of galleries, plus a rooftop sculpture garden. MMoCA is an independent, nonprofit organization presenting exhibitions by local, regional, national and international artists. A permanent collection of nearly 6,000 works of art is maintained and enlarged through gifts and purchases. The Museum's education department presents programs to increase public understanding and appreciation of modern and contemporary art.



Our docent tour will consist of three galleries featuring the art of *Santiago Cucullu*, the art of *Mel Chin* and a special treat - the *Fundred Project*, which "is a tangible and creative way to **draw** awareness about the dangers of lead poisoning," initiated by Mel Chin. 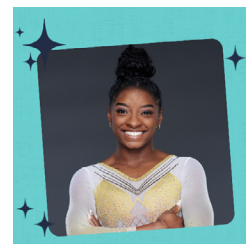
